Teachers are the most important in-school factor affecting student learning and well-being. The world faces a shortage of **44 million** teachers by 2030, threatening progress toward Sustainable Development Goal 4: quality education for all. Addressing this challenge requires stronger teacher policies, coordinated global action and sustained investment in the teaching profession.

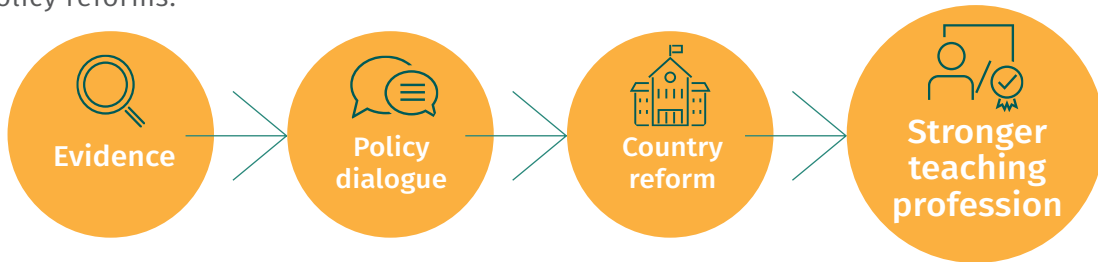

Complementing its convening and advocacy work, the Teacher Task Force contributes to **global frameworks and shared commitments** that guide teacher policy and strengthen coordinated action:

- Contributions to the **UN Secretary-General's High-Level Panel on the Teaching Profession**, and World Summit on Teachers which adopted the **Santiago Consensus** calling upon the network to continue convening countries and partners
- Co-creation of **global advocacy campaigns** through the network
- Support to the development of ISCED-T (International Standard Classification of Education – Teacher Training Programmes) and to the revision of indicators of SDG 4.c.
- Enabling the implementation of the **EU-funded Regional Teachers' Initiative in Africa**
